In October, Mike Grayson and Emily Tudball Chairs of Stutton Village Hall and Social Committees handed over a cheque for £1,000 to the Tadcaster Stingrays.

The money was raised at the recent Race Night and was donated to 16-year-old Jemima Browning who set up a swimming group for young people with disabilities.

Jemima, who lives in the village was inspired to set up Tadcaster Stingrays by her younger brother Will who has Down's Syndrome, believing that everyone should have the opportunity to enjoy sport. "This incredible sum of money will have a really positive impact," said Jemima. "It will ensure that my swimmers have the option to be supported through the lengthy and expensive process to become qualified to compete and we can further develop the squad. This gives them the same opportunity as many mainstream swimmers, which is a huge goal of mine."

Feedback from Stutton Social Committee AGM

The SSC held their AGM on 19 October to go through achievements and finances from the last year, and to elect members.

Full details of the chairs report, the financial report and bank statements can be found on the Parish Council website but below is a summary of key points;

SSC organised 13 events over the year including their first Summer fete.

In total SSC raised £3169.65 for charity.

The use of Facebook, Twitter and a newly set up emailing list has extended the reach of the committee creating wide network of people interested in attending and volunteering to help at events.

SSC took on board feedback and ideas from the survey which was carried out in the summer. Events organised should hopefully reflect some of that feedback.

The pop-up pub gave people the option of continuing to come from a drink and a chat once a week whilst the pub was closed. Although the intention was never to make any money from this venture, the money we did make has been used to buy two large marques which are available to hire and will be used at future events.

Granny P's recipe corner, Christmas cake

Christmas cake, some of us have a recipe that's passed down through the generations. This is my family recipe which has been passed down from mother to daughter; which started as far as we can remember with my great granny. Mum always put marzipan and then icing on ours but I always leave it un-iced as it's nearly always served with cheese (a large lump of cheese if Stewart has cut his own).



Ingredients

1/2lb of quality block (not spreadable) salted butter

1/2lb of soft brown sugar
1/2lb of pain flour
1/4lb ground almonds
4 medium eggs, beaten
2lb currents soaked for a day in brandy,
how much brandy you use depends on
taste I always use a good half bottle

Method

Grease and line a heavy cake tin, round or square about 9ins.

Cream the butter and sugar until soft and fluffy, add the beaten eggs a little at a time with a tablespoon of the flour at a time until the flour has gone.

Stir in the ground almonds, mix

Stir in the ground almonds, mix thoroughly but don't beat.

Add the currents with the brandy liquor and again mix well but don't beat it.
Turn the mixture in to the prepared tin and bake for 3

hours at 100oc.

Check after about 2 hours and if it looks like it could be burning on the top, cover it with some grease proof paper if not leave it.

After it's been in the oven for 3 hours you need to do the ultimate test, gently slide a knitting needle (or a skewer) in to the centre of the cake if the needle comes out clean it ready, if not cook it for a little longer.

Allow to cool in the tin, once it's cooled turn the cake out.

When the cake has completely cooled, wrap in grease proof paper

then foil (or brown paper) and finally a tea towel or muslin if you have it; and place it in an air tight tin with an apple.

If you're making it now, it will need turning but only once really; and a slug of brandy that's up to you!
