The grotto was brilliant and a fantastic job from everyone who helped especially Nigel and Chris C, and of course a special thank you to Father Christmas and his two elves who did the village proud.

Michelles choir entertained us along with Emily's band, and both were fantastic, so a big thank you to them, especially Michelle and Emily for co-ordinating it so perfectly.

Drinks made £55 profit, spent £130 on selection boxes buying 64 in total. Not all were given away on the night so we donated to the children singing for Martin House.

The raffle hamper made £149 (-£51.45) total £97.55

Next year, same format as previous years just reduce the amount of selection boxes.

It was also suggested that a donation bucket would be good to put out as people were asking about paying for Father Christmas and the craft stall and face painting.
