An update from 'SVHMC'

In little over six months since the Village Hall Management Committee volunteered for duty, we are pleased to be making quiet yet positive progress. Currently just a body of seven local residents, we are working together to lay the platform to preserve our village asset for this and future generations.

To work towards re-writing the 60-year-old constitution, switching to a charitable trust, and making the necessary improvements to the tired old building, we have been on a steep learning curve. We have joined relevant support bodies for guidance; attended training; tiptoed through a minefield of paperwork for grant applications; had regular team meetings to deal with the previously unthought-of issues for the building's upkeep; sought professional planning advice; and even facilitated our own workshop to consider the forward plan. It's all been going on, and much more!

The initial repairs and decoration were a vital first step and that was met thanks to wonderful local volunteers. We now have a website and our own Facebook group for sharing information. Our booking and accounting practices are improving. And we have more plans but things take time.

Community and private bookings are already up compared to recent years and now that the hall is available day and night, we can consider all enquiries for hire.

BUT DO YOU NEED THE VILLAGE HALL?

We welcome all of our regular hirers who bring in much needed income, and often go the extra mile with generous monetary donations and their precious time.

However, there is much work to be done, the overheads need to be met on a regular basis, and our goal has always been to attract more people from the region to use our asset.

The hall is available for private family functions, fitness, club meetings, social gatherings, entertainment nights, and whatever else people wish to use it for.

A Parish survey collated early in 2017 returned a list of events and activities that people in our community would be interested to see being held locally, and specifically utilising the village hall.

Many of those ideas are now a possibility. The venue is available through the day, rooms are clear of obstruction, and aesthetic improvements are ongoing. These things can happen through people volunteering a small amount of time each. The Social Committee and Village Hall Committee can both give advice to get things up and running. We can put people in touch with each other.

WHAT NEXT?

Decisions still need to be made as to the hall's future. Do we make do with small reactive changes, extend, rebuild or relocate? Which of those can we achieve and how? Watch this space...

In 2018 the Armistice Day and Remembrance Sunday fall on the same day. Sunday November. This is also the 100th Anniversary of the end of World War One. Parishes around the country see this day to be very significant and plan events. including the lighting of beacons and placing of permanent memorials.

Like the majority of UK communities, Stutton suffered tragic losses. Young men born in or residing in the area who went to war and did not return to their families.

Some of these men are remembered on the Tadcaster cenotaph and named inside St Mary's church. But nothing in Stutton other than a humble memorial placed on the village hall gates in November in recent years.

Should those brave men stay relatively forgotten in Stutton or could we mark their sacrifice in some way? Perhaps replicate neighbouring towns with an event or a lasting memorial?

Granny P's recipe corner, Chicken and Tarragon

Stroganoff

A Stutton favourite at any hotpot evening, Michelle's Chicken and Tarragon Stroganoff recipe has been requested so many times we thought we'd publish it!

Ingredients

4 Chicken breasts
Small packet of button mushrooms, sliced
14 Shallots or small onions, finely diced
½ jar or 2 tbsp tarragon
300ml Sour cream
1 tbsp Dijon mustard
1 tbsp French mustard
Salt and pepper to taste
Cornflour (for thickening, if required)

Method

Cook the shallots or onions until soft, add the chicken and brown.

Add the tarragon, sour cream, mustard and sliced mushrooms.

Cook for 30 minutes on hob or alternatively transfer to a slow cooker and cook for 2 hours.

If required use cornflour to thicken before serving.

Serve with roast potatoes or pasta.




