to attend an unveiling of a memorial stone dedicated to twenty-one men from the Parish who lost their lives in World War One but also serving as a place of comfort for people remembering their own loved ones of more modern times.

Stutton Village Hall, itself worthy of celebrating its 60th year, was decked in union flags and poppies made by the local craft club. A traditional tea party was organised by the Social Committee and the choir sang familiar songs from both world war eras.

Dignitaries from Stutton and neighbouring Tadcaster Council joined servicemen and women past and present, enjoying a moving occasion with local residents of all ages. The memorial, engraved sandstone donated by Wentbridge Stone near Pontefract, was organised in a venture between campaigners and the Parish Council.

Cannon Chris Wilton lead the blessing before Majors Pennett and Medlycott executed the unveiling. Nine-year-old cornet player Alexander Thompson (picture, left) performed a powerful 'Last Post' before a two-minute silence was adhered to by the congregation.





Granny P's recipe corner - Trench cake

During the first world war people in Britain would bake and post fruit cake to loved ones on the front line. Some traditional cakes were hard to come by due to rationing so this cake uses some alternative ingredients...



Ingredients

½ lb Flour
4oz Margarine
1tsp vinegar
½ pint milk
3oz brown sugar
3oz cleaned currents
2tsp cocoa
½ tsp baking soda
Pinch of Nutmeg
1tsp ground ginger
Grated lemon rind

Method

- 1. Grease and line a tin
- 2. Rub in the margarine into the flour in a mixing bowl
- 3. Add the dry ingredients (bar the soda) and mix well
- 4. Dissolve the soda in the vinegar and milk and add
- 5. Beat well and turn into the tin
- 6. Bake at gas mark 3, 180 degrees for 2 hours
